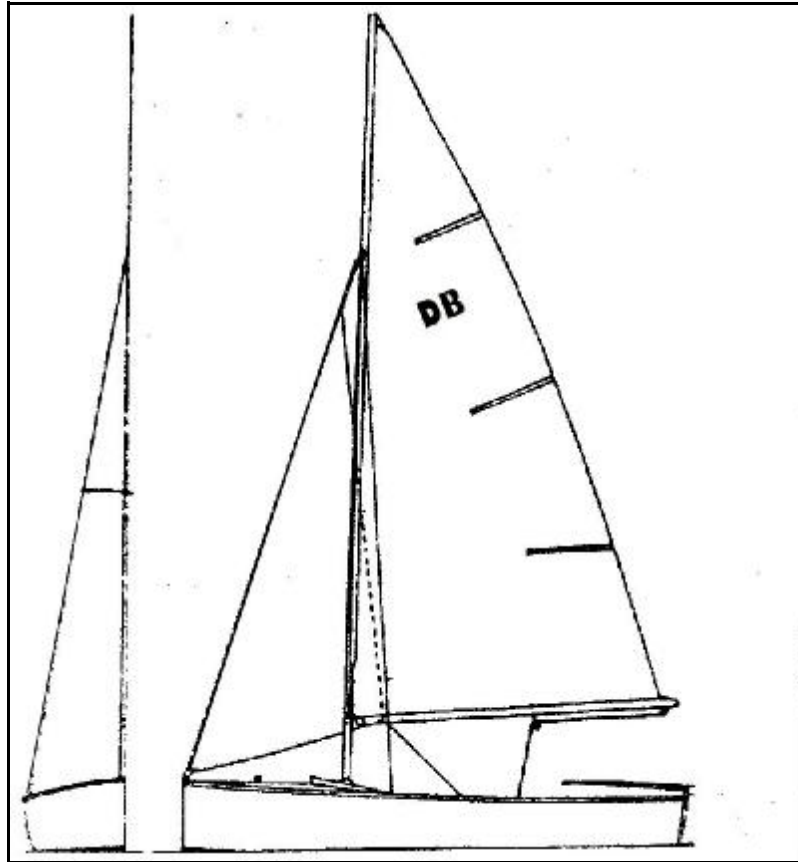


YACHTING WORLD DAYBOAT



The Yachting World Dayboat was designed in 1949 by G O'Brien Kennedy , MRINA, as a robust , round -bilged dinghy suitable for all types of waters including estuaries and coasts. Over the years it has proved to be a capable cruising boat and with a modern rig and sails gives excellent racing performance.

It is very well balanced with a small but efficient jib which means that it can be safely crewed by adult and child. The steel lifting centre plate gives a considerable degree of basic stability.

The class is supported by an active class association (www.ywdb.co.uk) which exists to promote both racing and cruising and to help members get the most out of owning a YW Dayboat.

Owners are to be found in all parts of the UK and clubs with more than ten YW Dayboats in their fleets are to be found at Bosham SC (Chichester Harbour), Gravesend SC (lower Thames), Poole YC (Poole Harbour) and Thornbury SC (Severn Estuary near Bristol).
